HAWK Hochschule Hildesheim/Holzminden/Göttingen University of Applied Sciences and Arts is a public university which was established under the decree of the Lower Saxony Ministry of Education and Science in 1971, Federal State of Lower Saxony, Germany.

As a typical "University of Applied Sciences" HAWK concentrates its study programmes in engineering and other technical disciplines, business-related studies, social work, health, and design areas. Six faculties – Architecture, Engineering and Conservation (Hildesheim), Design (Hildesheim), Social Work and Health (Hildesheim), Management, Social Work and Construction (Holzminden), Engineering and Health (Göttingen) and Resource Management (Göttingen) – offer a wide, partly unique variety of 29 bachelor and 18 master programmes in Northern Germany.



The common mission of applied research and development implies a distinct application-oriented focus and professional character of studies which include integrated and supervised work assignments in industry, enterprises or other relevant institutions.

With about 6.400 students and more than 500 academic and administrative staff the HAWK belongs to the medium-sized universities. The cities of Hildesheim, Holzminden and Göttingen are located 100 km apart from each other. In Hildesheim (100.000 inhabitants, 3.300 HAWK students, 30 km south of Hannover) the administration headquarter of HAWK is located, in an atmosphere with a lively student scene. Göttingen (120.000 inhabitants, 1.800 HAWK students, 120 km south of Hannover) is characterized as a famous university city with a high academic

and international reputation. Holzminden (20.000 inhabitants, 1.300 HAWK students) convinces with a familiar study atmosphere on a largely new campus and a beautiful scenic location 100 km southwest of Hannover.

About 115 international cooperation agreements are the basis for mobility in studying and teaching as well as for projects in knowledge and technology transfer and applied research. HAWK positions itself with four research focus areas (Forschungsschwerpunkte): Laser and Plasma Technology, Regional Development – Education – Participation, Green Engineering and Ecosystems, and Health, Technology and Digitalization.

Academic Calendar

The academic year of HAWK is divided into two semesters:

- the winter semester starting in autumn (1 October 31 March),
- the summer semester in spring (1 April 30 September).

For all new international students the International Office offers introduction weeks before the semester starts in September and March.





International applicants send their application directly to the HAWK (not via Uni-Assist, the University Application Service for International Students). The International Office of HAWK can inform you about cur-

rent courses and linguistic opportunities and can advise or help you with questions concerning foreign students in Germany, especially regarding the application process for a place to study.

Unless you wish to receive information if your higher education certificate qualifies for a master programme at HAWK, then you have to apply directly.

Information on the admission procedure for international applicants

In order to apply at HAWK Hochschule Hildesheim/Holzminden/Göttingen you need to submit an online application at https://hisinone.hawk.de which is possible within six weeks before the application deadline. Once submitted you need to print the application form, sign it and send it to HAWK Hochschule Hildesheim/Holzminden/Göttingen (International Office) together with all documents mentioned on the form. Once we have received your application we have to validate whether your documents and certificates can be regarded as equivalent



to a German qualification for admission to higher education. The validation takes place as soon as we have received the complete set of application documents (for necessary application documents see below). Without these documents we cannot process your request or – if applicable – sign you up for the foundation course (Studienkolleg).

In general, you are allowed to study in Germany if you are allowed to study in your home country as well. Detailed information can be found on www.anabin.de. The information is based on the publications and decisions of the Standing Conference of the Ministers of Education and Cultural Affairs of the Länder in the Federal Republic of Germany (www.kmk.org/kmk/information-in-english.html).

If the original document is not issued in English or German, you need to hand in certified copies of the approved translation as well

If you need to apply before you have access to the online application, you need to fill and sign our application form and send it to us with all the required documents. The application form can be found on our website: www.hawk.de/en/international/applicants. Additionally, you need to submit the online application shortly before the application deadline. Otherwise, it is not possible to sign you up for a place to study.

In some restricted bachelor programmes, the admission to the programme is coordinated nationwide. Therefore, the first step towards a place to study is the registration with www.hochschulstart.de. Following a successful registration, you receive an applicant-ID (BID) and an authentication number (BAN). These are necessary for the online application at HAWK Hochschule Hildesheim/Holzminden/Göttingen. Please check the desired study programme for further details.

German language skills

Since all our programmes are held mainly in German it is necessary to have sufficient language skills to follow the lectures. Therefore, in order to be accepted you need to prove your qualifications with one of the recognized German tests listed on page 10. For applicants holding a B1-level in German, HAWK Language Centre offers preparatory language courses leading up to the TestDaF exam (online). For further information on offered language levels, dates and fees please check www.hawk.de/en/testdaf. Courses and tests can be taken at any other language institute as well. Some language course providers close to our study locations are listed on page 11.

Assessment test or preliminary practical training

In some study programmes it is necessary to hand in additional application documents such as a proof of a preliminary practical training or the application form for the assessment test. Please check the desired study programme for further details.

Study fees

For one semester at HAWK you will have to pay about 300 – 400 Euro semester fees, depending on the study location. This includes a ticket to use the local trains in Lower Saxony free of charge (and for the study locations in Hildesheim and Göttingen also the city buses).

Recognized German language certificates

Applicants who are qualified to start their studies directly need to hand in one of the following German tests within the application deadline:

- TestDaF (Test Deutsch als Fremdsprache des TestDaF-Instituts) minimum level 3 or 4, depending on the requested study programme (please check the desired study programme for further details)
- DSH (Deutsche Sprachprüfung für den Hochschulzugang) minimum level 1 or 2, depending on the requested study programme (please check the desired study programme for further details)
- Deutsches Sprachdiplom der Kultusministerkonferenz (2. Stufe)
- telc Deutsch C1 Hochschule
- Zertifikat C2 from Goethe-Institut

Preparatory course (Studienkolleg)

In order to be admitted to the entrance test for the preparatory course you need to hand in one of the following German certificates:

- telc Deutsch B1
- 7ertifikat B1 from Goethe-Institut



Scholarships

There are a few scholarships for students at HAWK but you do not qualify for these scholarships until you are in your second or third year of study.

Application deadlines

The general application deadline at HAWK for a start of studies in October (winter semester) is July 15 or August 15 and for a start of studies in April it is January 15 or February 15 each year. However, this might vary for the different study programmes or the assessment test. Therefore, please check the desired study programme for further details. Late documents will not be taken into account.

In order to participate you need to apply via https://mappe.hawk.de by April 30 (for the following winter semester)/October 30 of each year. Upload 7–10 work samples. After approval through the assessment committee, you will receive an invitation to the practical artistic examination in Hildesheim. On this examination day, you need to show your uploaded portfolio plus 8-10 more work samples, work on two tasks and have a short conversation with us in which we want to get to know you a little better and discuss design-related topics. After 14 days you will receive a notification with your score. This document remains valid for 3 years in case of repeated applications. With this you can apply for the summer

semester (deadline January 15) or the

winter semester (deadline July 15).

Please note:

If more applicants meet the admission requirements than places available, the places are allocated according to the results of a selection procedure carried out by the university. This means that the final grade (Bachelor) can be improved by participating in a selection interview shortly after the application deadline and by provided proof of practical work experience after the Bachelor degree.


